What is a Code Ranger?

- Fort Worth Code Rangers is a voluntary program that works in support of the City's Code Compliance Department. Code Compliance serves nearly 750,000 residents covering more than 300 square miles. That's a lot of area to cover for a limited number of city code officers. Code Rangers serve as an important group of concerned residents who monitor their neighborhoods as it relates to code violations.
- Neighborhoods with a Code Ranger in place have seen a drastic improvement in the overall health, safety and appearance of their neighborhood.
- In some neighborhoods there's been an 80 percent decrease of violations.

Duties of a Code Ranger

- Code Rangers assist with such duties as the removal of bandit signs and monitoring specific code violations to include fences on rights-of-way in need of repair, accumulation of trash and debris in yard, improper bulk waste set-out and overflowing garbage.
- Code Rangers are provided the appropriate equipment to report the problem. Once a problem is reported via an online form, a courtesy notice is generated to the resident or business owner.

Guidelines

- Must live within the Fort Worth city limits and be 18 years of age
- Successfully complete the Code Rangers training course.
